INTRODUCTION OF GUIA2 PROJECT

GUIA2 is working to empower and improve employability of people with disability (PWD) and art-educators (EDU) who work for and with this population. Therefore, it is in line with goals set by the EU Ministries responsible for Education (the Paris Declaration, 2015): "strengthening the key contribution which education makes to personal development, social inclusion and participation", "ensuring inclusive education for all", "empowering teachers so that they are able to take an active stand against all forms of discrimination" and that educators can "meet the needs of pupils from diverse backgrounds". In terms of the needs of target groups: GUIA2! uses artistic education to address the immediate needs of PWD and EDU by combating marginalization and social discrimination but also low basic skills which are present due to high levels of self-stigma and low self-esteem (Corrigan, 2009). Inclusive education which includes artistic expression is crucial in this process as it helps raise selfesteem (O'Toole et.al., 2010), helps develop basic skills (Key Competences) of those involved and motivates them for education. This, in turn, gives greater employability.

GUIA2 project is based on GUIA partnership which became an example of good practice in 2013 and addresses organizations experienced in inclusive and participatory work, especially in the field of performing arts; theatre, dance, music...

WORKSHOP- 4 IN NORTHERN IRELAND

The workshop took place in various locations in the city Belfast, Northern Ireland between the 5 - 9 September 2019. The University of Atypical (Arts and Disability Forum) is an arts organisation that is led by disabled people and as such the participants and team are all people who identify as disabled. We developed a programme of creative workshops to reflect the core principles of the organisation to empower disabled people and raise the creative voices of disabled artists, participants and audiences.

Objectives & Target Group of Workshop-4

We build every project with the ethos of the 'Social Model' of disability and our objective for this workshop programme was the inclusion of disabled arts professionals and participants to build a creative network and develop unique skills in a fully supported framework of inclusive practice. The targeted group who took part in the workshops were adults who identify as disabled. We used the 'social model' of disability as a way of viewing the world, developed directly by disabled people and their experience.

Using the 'Social Model' principles people are disabled by barriers constructed within our society, not by the person's impairment or disability. The barriers exist in a number of ways and can be physical, like buildings not being accessible. This model also addresses people's attitudes to disability as a result of socially constructed, outdated attitudes about what disabled people can and can not do.

The social model urges us to recognise the barriers that disable people, and by removing these barriers we create a more equitable society where disabled people's rights are honoured by creating the conditions for more independence, choice and control. We aimed to ensure that our participants and artists had an enjoyable creative experience while sharing stories and cultural practices in a collaborative creative journey that develops new skills both personally and creatively. We used a number of different locations with the city of Belfast for the workshops as a way of engaging local organisations to the project, inclusive practice and to the creative process. The workshops took place simultaneously with the annual festival ran by the University of Atypical called Bounce Arts Festival and as such it was a prime opportunity for the partner organisations to explore additional activities happening in disability arts practice.



Program of Workshop-4

It is a 5-day workshop. Participants attended 6 hours of activities each day. Here is the program day by day:

Stage Beyond Creative Workshop



Oh Yeah Music Center

Performance, Dance and movement



This workshop explored performance, dance and movement and was organised by the Arts and Disability Forum. The workshop was facilitated by Stage Beyond is an award winning theatre company for adults with learning disabilities, who offer professional arts training in a variety of disciplines. The aims are to encourage self-esteem, sociability and life skills.

Objectives & Target Group

The objective of this workshop was to build creative engagement and participation within the arts for people with disabilities. The group was made up of young disabled people and non disabled people working together in developing movement and performance skills. Participants learned how to work as part of a team and ways of collaborating creatively.

Background: wide variety of backgrounds

Welcome

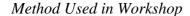
Introductions exercise - ways of introducing yourself and who you are to a large group of people building confidence and self esteem amongst participants.

Working together - exercise in developing ways of working as part of a team creatively and understanding your importance as a team member.

Movement skills - developing a range of movements to express yourself through physical theatre.

Group movement - creative exercise in being part of a team and moving together in the creation of a moving sculpture.

Mirroring exercise - Mirroring a partner





- ☐ Stage Beyond is an award winning theatre company for adults with learning disabilities, the ethos is to make the arts and education accessible through innovation, creativity and inclusion.
- ☐ The method used in our workshop was a peer to peer learning process guided by the facilitator. Participants were encouraged to develop their creativity by having an active voice in the process and contributing their ideas and movements in devising a new physical movement work.

Activities





Two creative sessions with Scotish artist Cameron Morgan in Moonbase, Belfast.

Cameron ran two workshops with artist/tutor/friend Jason Pyper. Both workshops were on Friday 6th September. The same workshop delivered to two different groups – max 5 per group. The theme was 'animal collage'.

Objectives & Target Group

The objective of this workshop was to explore collage as a creative medium and how to use ready made image to create a new image. The workshop was specifically focused on the creation of collages reflecting animals and exploring the possibilities of collage in the creation of new beasts.

The workshop began with an introduction from Cameron and Jason followed by the participants being invited to introduce themselves. Cameron invited participants to pick an animal that they



would like to make a collage of and the process encouraged participants to respond in an intuitive creative way in a relaxed, friendly environment.

Method Used in Workshop

☐ The method used in both workshops embraced the development of disbled artists and participants' creativity. Cameron Morgan is an artist working in a supported studio in Scotland and is an artist with a learning disability who has developed a successful art practice and as such has developed a wide range of technical skills in the creation of his work.

The function of inviting Cameron to facilitate this workshop is a key method of building up the representation of disabled artists and developing their ability in teaching their skills to others. Both artists and participants got to learn from each other and build upon their confidence and creativity sharing skills and techniques.

The sharing of time, skills and visibility builds upon our methods' logic of making art by, and with disabled artists; in turn nurturing the confidence of disabled participants. Cameron's practice in art is a source of inspiration for participants who wish to build a creative practice and he shared advice about how to practice as an artist.

Lady Vendredi workshop- Afrodiasporic

Ritual as Afrofuturist Technology

Flax Art Studios - Green Room

Performance, Dance and movement

Niki Collier felting workshop

Objectives & Target Group

Target group - Afrofuturist, people of colour, queer audiences, culture vultures, Neurodivergent people and disabled people.

The objective of this workshop was to build understanding of Afrofuturism and develop a greater understanding of our bodies and the connectedness to our cultural expression.



Method Used in Workshop

Afrodiasporic Ritual as Afrofuturist Technology. A physical, ritual and imaginative workshop drawing on Afro diasporic ritual actions as a way of accessing intuitive movement and group intimacy and research into the neuroscience of sensory perception towards connecting the sensory and the imaginative.

This workshop particularly aimed at people of the African diaspora and people of colour, but was open to all. We explored centres of movement linked to revolution, release and empowerment alongside exercises of sensory deprivation and immersion towards understanding the inner and outer worlds.

Activities

How to Bounce: A Creative Writing Masterclass with Alice McCulllough

Objectives & Target Group

The objective of this workshop was to explore language and the creative use of words to build stories, narratives and poems.

Method Used in Workshop

☐ The artist used a number of different methods to help participants devise a piece of text using emotional language and words as a starting point to build from. Project participants developed creative skills of expression and the powerful use of language in articulating ideas to the world.





8 September, 2019

Activities

Niki Collier Felt Music - Just See sound and light workshop, Atypical Gallery Visual Art, Music

Objectives & Target Group

The objective of this workshop was to learn a range of different felting techniques and develop creative textile artworks working with a disabled facilitator and artist Niki Collier.

The target group was adults who identify as disabled with a curiosity for textile art and learning.

Method Used in Workshop

☐ Wet Felting - Hot water with soap is sprayed onto layers of wool, while repeated agitation and compression causes the fibres of the wool to hook and weave together into a single piece of fabric.



□ Needle felting- This method doesn't require any water. You use a special needle that has notches along its shaft; these catch the wool fibres and tangle them with other fibres to produce felt.

Activities

Claymation workshop with Joel Simon and Can Do Academy

Atypical Gallery

Visual Art, Film



Objectives & Target Group

The objective for this workshop was to devise a short story and then create a stop motion animation using coloured clays to create movable characters. The participants worked alongside artist Joel Simon to sculpt character, film and edit short films using ipads

Method Used in Workshop

☐ The method used in this workshop is called stop motion and is a technique used in animated filmmaking. The participants' sculpted objects were physically moved in small increments and photographed frame by frame. They then edited the images to play in sequins to appear to be in motion. back. The participants used plasticine to sculpt their characters and used an ipad to record the images and edit the sequence of frames into a short animated film.



Activities

Streetwise Community Circus Skills workshop

Brian Friel Theatre

Dance and movement

Objectives & Target Group

Following on from a live performance by adults with learning disabilities Streetwise community circus facilitated a workshop in basic circus skill designed for beginners. Participants got to learn how to use circus style tricks and methods of presenting them to an audience.



Method Used in Workshop

Participants had the opportunity to learn from circus performers the skills required to perform using juggling, diabolo, hula hoop, plate spinning and clowning. Each unique skill requires a different method.

Ш	Juggling - required the participants to follow instructions and develop listening skills,
	the development of hand to eye coordination and timing skills.
	Hula Hoop - required that the participants used the movement of the body to swing the
	hoop and this method helps develops movement, rhythm and momentum.
	Diabolo - consisting of an axle bobbin in an hourglass/egg timer shape. The participants
	learned how to spin using a string attached to two hand sticks. Various types of
	interaction with the sticks, string, and using various parts of the body.
	Plate spinning - is a juggling act where the participants had to keep as many plates
	spinning on top of poles. When the plates stop spinning they fall. This method of circus
	act requires agility and speed and helps develop coordination.
	Clowning - The method used to learn clowning involves in the first instance helping
	people feel free and let go of their inhibitions and worry by creating an environment of
	playful expression and trusting each other to experiment with being silly with the aim
	to make people happy.

Evaluation

13 Participants filled pre-survey before workshop and the post-survey after the workshop.
